Wallace Hartley's Violin

This is the amazing story of Wallace Hartley and his violin aboard the RMS Titanic.

Wallace Hartley was a violinist on board the RMS Titanic when it hit an iceberg and sank on April 14th 1912.

As I am sure you know that he, along with his bandmates continued to play until the ship went down.

They say their final tune was "Nearer to My God To Thee" and it is claimed that his final words were

"Gentlemen, I bid you farewell".

Well in 2006 his violin was discovered!



It appears that as the ship was sinking, he put the violin into his leather bag, hoping he could use it as a float while he was in the water. Unfortunately, it didn't fit, the bow was too long. The result, his body was found 10 days later, along with the water damaged violin.

The violin was a gift from his fiancée Maria Robinson, so she requested it back and kept it.

In 2006 it was discovered in what would have been her attic by an amateur musician. It still had on it the plaque Maria had put on it before she gave it to him "For Wallace on the occasion of our engagement"

In 2013 it was put up for auction and was sold for \$1.7Million dollars!

Have your children create for themselves a survivors diary. Use a piece of A4 card folded in half, and add pages by folding A4 paper in half and use an elastic band to put pages into the diary. Pages can be stained with a tea bag in luke warm water for authenticity.

Survivors are cold, they are hungry, and have just been rescued by the RMS Carpathia. It is the morning of the 15th April 1912.

What would they feel? are they fretting over lost loved ones?
Are they happy to be alive? or are they concerned they've lost their luggage?

Did they hear Wallace Hartley and his band as the mighty ship lipped beneath the waves?
